### **DIRECTION**

Determine mission, vision and strategic direction

- Guard the Mission
- Develop strategic plan
- Monitor performance based on key milestones

Be the brain trust - ask questions

# **LEADERSHIP**

Select, support & evaluate the chief executive

- Form a partnership with the CEO
- Evaluate the CEO's performance & compensation
- Create a succession plan



### LAW & ETHICS

Ensure legal & ethical integrity

- Duties of care, loyalty & compliance
- Board has the authority as a group, not as individual members
- Ensure risk management
- 96% of nonprofits carry Directors & Officers Liability Insurance (D&O) for their boards

# **ADVOCATE**

Be mission ambassadors

- Develop & use the elevator speech
- Cultivate connections within the larger community
- Advocate as needed



### **FUNDRAISING**

Ensure adequate resources

- 100% Individual contributions
- 100% engaged in donor recognition & recruitment

Review and Forecast

- Annual budget
- Regular financial statements / cash flow
- Annual audit
- Financial forecast Investment policy

### **BOARD** DEVELOPMENT

The board is responsible for the board

- Establish a strong Governance Committee Adopt best practices
- Review & update
- bylaws periodically
- Educate, orient and communicate often

#### **Best Practices:**

- Focus on issues of consequence (not minutiae)
- Communicate expectations & accountability for board members Respond to & support the CEO
- Establish relevant working committees
- Recruit for diverse perspectives and expertise Work hard to engage every board member
- Groom future leaders
- Choreograph good meetings
